We are introducing a new and exciting programme across school starting with Year 6. Relax Kids can help children:

- Learn valuable mindfulness and relaxation tools
- Develop good mental health
- Build self-confidence and self-esteem
- Build emotional resilience
- Self-regulate
- Develop focus and concentration
- Become more imaginative and creative
- Manage anger, anxiety and stress
- Increase brain power and feel happier!

These sessions will take place during the school day with a fully qualified and trained coach. I will keep you informed about it and get some responses from the children.

The children have been writing rhyming words and continuing rhyming strings. They have completed lots of their challenges linked to this topic.

In Year 6 we are continuing with our book, Wonder, but this term we are focusing on bullying and the key question 'should bullies be punished?'. We are going to be researching arguments for and against before producing a balanced argument.



Our World Book Day prize winners in their wonderful costumes. They each received a £10 voucher for WH Smiths where there are lots of wonderful books to choose from!






All of our pupils had a wonderful day sharing stories and creating fantastic pieces of work, based on fabulous books!
