### **EYFS**

In Nursery this term we are learning all about the seaside. Our story this week is Sharing a Shell. This story is about sea creatures who are learning how to share with each other.

Upper Foundation have come back to school raring to go. We have been learning about The Rainbow Fish as part of our new topic all about the seaside! We have shared ideas about being a good friend and sharing. In PE this week we have been preparing for sports day. The children have really enjoyed taking part in the different races.

## Key Stage 1

**KS1** chiildren have had a lovely first week back after our half term holiday break. We have begun to read 'Katie in London' and all the children are really getting involved with this book. Linked to this we have all learned about St Paul's Cathedral and the children then designed their own cathedral using different religious symbols. All children are impressing us with their much improved reading skills. They are showing real determination and resilience and it is great to see. Well done! Keep up the good work!

**Nurture** children from KS1 are covering the topic "Katie goes to London". We have enjoyed making our own bunting as well as London buses and telephone boxes. The children have also been predicting stories and have done some brilliant writing. KS2 children have been working on friendships and transition to high school/new classes in preparation for September.

## Lower Key Stage 2

**Year 3** have kicked off their Vikings study by making Viking helmets and Longship figureheads. As well as following instructions to make their Viking creations, the children have written their own instructions and looked at the features of a instruction writing. The Vikings topic is connected to the current book we are reading: 'How to Train Your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell. Lots of interesting learning coming up over the next few weeks so please ask your children all about it.

**Year 3/4** have been finding out about the Muslim celebration of Eid, which happens after a month of fasting for Ramadan. We have also been designing, making and evaluating Viking helmets. We have thought about D-day and listened to war time songs.

**Year 4** have been developing into masters of bar charts in Maths. In English we have started our new class book – How to Train Your Dragon and we have been writing some dragon related rhyming poems taking our inspiration from the story. As the book is set in the Viking era we have started this topic off by creating our very

own Viking helmets!

## Upper Key Stage 2

This week in **Year 5** we have been recapping our knowledge of translation and rotation of shapes. We have been plotting a shape's original coordinates and recording the position of the shape after translation. We even tried it out on the playground!
