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#### **EYFS**

Nursery had a wonderful day in Scarborough. The children enjoyed time with their grown ups and had a great time in the sunshine on the beach. We even had a paddle in the cold sea!

Upper Foundation have been painting sea creatures linked to the topic this half term. The children are enjoying learning all about the creatures that live in the ocean.

# Key Stage 1

This week Year 1 have been reading 'The Tin Forest'. They have learned all about the meaning 'emerging' and how the Tin Forest grew and changed over time. We then planted cress seeds and throughout this week we have been recording how the seeds have emerged, grown and changed. Get ready for some egg and cress sandwiches!

Year 1/2 and Year 2 children have been busy creating fact files about famous London landmarks. The fact files contain lots of information the children have researched. In Maths the children have been dividing using their knowledge of times tables to help solve division problems.

# Key Stage 2

## Year 3

In Year 3 this week the children have been editing and improving their writing. The children are writing stories based on Viking Myths. Weights and measures have been the focus of learning this week in maths. The children have been weighing and measuring using a range of equipment. There is a rumour Year Three have been weighing ingredients in preparation to bake a cake!

## Year 3/4

The children have been learning about the major organs of the human body and investigating invertebrates and vertebrates. Using modelling clay the children have created pieces of work that demonstrate the organs in the human body. Well done class 3/4!

## Year 4

The children have been investigating and learning about the lines of symmetry of a range of 2D shapes. They have extended their learning looking at kines of symmetry involving different orientation! Mrs Hopwood is very impressed with the work the children have completed this week. Well done Year 4!

## Year 5

We have had a busy week in Year Five! We have combined our Maths, Art, Science and Design technology skills and we have begun to create a sundial! We have used protractors to measure angles accurately, used our knowledge of mixing colours to paint our designs, demonstrated how to use tools safely and used our knowledge of planets to create our designs! Here is some of our work so far...



## Year 5/6

The children in Year 5 have been using the data found in graphs to find information and answer questions related to the data. In English the children have used theirs skills they have developed over the year to write adventure stories. In Science the children are building rockets!

## Year 6

The children have been inspired with a Shine trip to York University this week. The children had the opportunity to visit the university campus and experience what it would be like to go to university. The preparations for the Year 6 performance are continuing to go well. The children are excited to perform to parents and the rest of the school.
