Remote Learning

Our remote learning platforms will be continuing everyday until the lockdown period ceases. My expectation is that 100% of pupils who are not in school should be accessing this to ensure all children continue to learn and do not fall behind. If you require any support with accessing our online learning please let us know. The content of the online learning mirrors what is taking place in school and I already appreciate the positive feedback we have received from some parents!

Remote Learning Video tutorial

After speaking to some parents, we have found that some of the reasons people are struggling to access the remote learning is due to issues logging on. To help you access this, Mr Shuttleworth has kindly produced a short guide video which I am sure will help you access Microsoft Teams if you are stuck. Weekly telephone calls

As in the previous period of lockdown, you will receive a weekly phone call from either your child's class teacher or a member of the Senior Leadership Team. This is simply just to check in and support with any barriers to learning and ensure your children are okay. I really appreciate that the staff of De Lacy do this as I know the children enjoy speaking to their teachers and miss seeing them every day. Our calls my come through on a private or withheld number - I would kindly ask that you accept these calls which will allow us to ensure any barriers to learning can be rectified.

Home support and homework

The learning journey of each child can only be successful with a productive partnership between home and school. You can help by:

- Ensuring your child is able to access the remote learning, on time and in a room where they're able to concentrate whilst still supervised.
- Listening to your child read at least 4 times a week. Ask questions about what you have read together, can they retrieve and use information they have just read?
- Help them with their timetables and the fundamentals of adding, subtracting, diving and multiplying numbers.
- Ensure they complete their homework or spellings they may have to learn that week.
- Discuss what they are learning in their learning is there any way they can continue to learn topics at home?
